Waterless urinals use 455ml in 5l water, spray onto surface, allow 5min and rinse. Hard floors: Mix 238ml in 5l water, apply with mop and allow 5min contact time. Scrub and mop with clean water. Spot and stain removal: Mix 45ml in 500ml water, spray onto stain, blot area to remove stain, rinse with water, blot and allow to dry. For difficult stains use neat, cover with a clean white towel or cloth and leave for as long as possible ideally overnight. Then blot and rinse with water, blot and dry. Extraction cleaning: Ensure carpet is vacuumed and any stains treated prior to cleaning. Mix 455ml in 5l water, pre-spray the carpet and allow 5min contact time. Mix 48ml in 5l water and clean the carpet. Bins: Mix 45ml in 500ml water or 455ml in 5l water and apply product with cloth or mop, allow contact time and scrub with brush.
