Ensure that there is adequate lighting for the task in hand 3. Wet surface signs available and utilised 4. Operatives should have suitable safety shoes with a good tread on their soles 5. Good housekeeping to be used at all times, no trailing leads, equipment to be stored away appropriately 6. Ensure chemicals are used as per manufacturer's instructions to prevent leaving the floor slippery due to excess chemicals used. 7. Do not use excessive amount of water while cleaning the floor. 8. Equipment cables to be kept behind or on your side to prevent tripping or being caught in the moving parts of the machine used.
