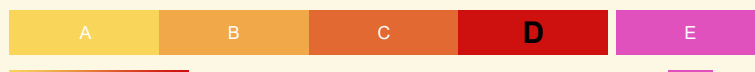

How should the substance(s) be disposed of?

How should the substance(s) be stored?

Store in original container. Keep tightly closed in a dry, cool and well-ventilated place.

Avoid heat, freezing and ultraviolet light.

Keep container upright to prevent spillages.

Store away from unauthorised personnel.



How should accidental release/spillage of this substance(s) be dealt with

Evacuate personnel to safe areas.

Wear personal protective equipment. Avoid contact with the skin and the eyes.

Prevent material from entering sewers, waterways, or low areas. Do not allow to dry. If gross quantities of the product contaminates rivers and lakes or drains inform respective authorities.

Dilute with water. Pick up and transfer to properly labelled containers. After cleaning, flush away traces with water. Or where applicable absorb with liquid-binding non combustible material (sand, diatomite, acid binders, and universal binders). Keep in suitable, closed containers for disposal. Flush away residuals with plenty of water.
